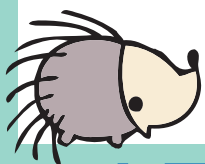




A Little Folk Tale

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A Little Folk Tale

Quilt size: 65½" x 63½"

Fabric requirements:

6" (15cm) of twenty assorted Folk Tale fabrics

40" (1m) of white fabric for sashings

20" (50cm) binding fabric

4yards (3.5m) of backing fabric

Cutting requirements:

Twelve assorted 5" x WOF Folk Tale strips

Forty eight assorted 5" Folk Tale squares

Eleven 1½" x 41½" white strips

Forty four 1½" x 5" white strips

Eight 1½" x WOF white strips

Seven 2½" x WOF strips for binding

Making "A Little Folk Tale"

- Take the twelve assorted 5" x WOF Folk Tale strips and eleven 1½" x WOF white strips. Place each strip one below the other in alternate order and stitch together along the length pressing seams as you stitch each row.
- Continue sewing strips together into one panel, this will form the centre of the quilt top.

- Take twelve 5" assorted squares and eleven 1½" x 5" white strips. Place the squares and strips one below the other in alternate order and stitch together pressing seams as you stitch. Make four of these strip panels.

- Take two 1½" x WOF white strips and join them together end to end to make one length, trim to measure one 1½" x 65½" strip. Make four of these strips.

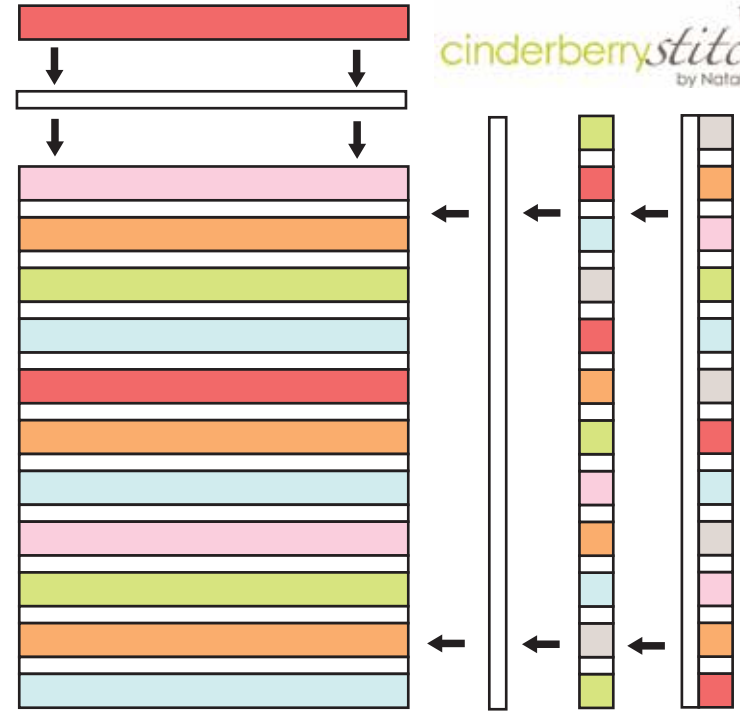
- Take two strip panels and one 1½" x 65½" white strip, match raw edges and sew the white strip between the two pieced strips to make the side panel, press seam. Make two of these.

- Take one side panel and one 1½" x 65½" white strip, match raw edges and sew the white strip to the right of the side panel, press the seam. Sew the side panel to the left side of the centre quilt top.

- Take the remaining side panel and 1½" x 65½" white strip, match raw edges and sew the white strip to the left of the side panel, press the seam. Sew the side panel to the right side of the centre quilt top.

- Layer the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and baste together – quilt as desired.

- Sew the seven 2½" strips together end to end and use this as the binding for your quilt.



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
