# Forget-me-not

## by ann d hansen of pixie girl quilts



Finished Size: 45 ½" x 59 ½" Block Size: 10 ¼" x 10 ¼" (raw edge to raw edge)

Fabric Requirements: based on 42" wide fabric

1/8 yard of 9 prints- small florals and dots (pinwheel,1 flying geese, block sashing and border posts)

1/8 yard of 3 tone on tone prints (flying geese)

1/4 yard of 4 prints- med florals (flying geese)

7/8 yard of eyelet/lace or solid (block sashing and inner border)

7/8 yard floral print (side and corner triangles) 1 3/4 yards larger floral print (outer border) 1/2 yard yellow dot (binding)

3 yards backing

### Cutting Instructions for One Block:

4 A's- 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" (med florals)

Pinwheels:

2 of each print- 3 1/4" x 3 1/4" (small florals and dots)

Flying Geese:

4-3 1/4" x 3 1/4" (tone on tone) 1-53/4" x 53/4" (med florals)


You will need a total of 8 blocks.

Block Sashing:

4 B's- 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" (dot)

8 C's- 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" (eyelet/lace)

4 D's- 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" (eyelet/lace)



#### Sewing Instructions for Pieced 1/2 - Square Pinwheel Center Blocks:

To make your half square blocks you will need One- 3 1/4" x 3 1/4" square and One- 3 1/4" x 3 1/4" coordinating square.

You will get 2 half square blocks out of every 1 you make.

I take all my background blocks and with a pencil draw the cut line on the diagonal and then take my ruler and draw a 1/4"

on each side for my sew line.

Once you have sewn on each line cut them apart on the diagonal cut line. Press seams open for less bulk.

Put together Pinwheel. See diagram and Block above for direction of half squares in pinwheel.

Press all seams open for less bulk. Trim finished Pinwheel block to 4 1/2" x 4 1/2.

#### Sewing Instructions for the Flying Geese:

1).Place two A's on to p of one B with right sides together. See diagram1.

2). Sew a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line. See diagram 1.

3). Cut apart on drawn line. See diagram 2.

4). Open up and press towards the A's. See diagram 3.

5). Place another A in the corner and sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn line. Repeat w/other side.

6). Cut apart on drawn line and press

toward the A. See diagram 5 and 6.

Trim so your finished flying goose measures 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".

#### Piecing instructions for Block:

To construct a block you will need to put each section together first. Section 1 and 3 are A, C, Flying Goose, C, A. Section 2 is Flying Goose, D, Pinwheel, D, Flying Goose. Look at Block Diagram above for placement and direction of flying geese. For the sashing in between put together 2 strips: C, B,D,B,C. Add your Sashing strips to the top and bottom of Section 2 then add Section 1 and 3. Press seams open.

#### Cutting and Sewing Side and Corner Triangles:

Side Triangles: Cut 1 strip 16 ½" x width of fabric. Cut into two 16 ½"x 16 ½" squares. Cut each square diagonally twice to make 8 side triangles. Corner Triangles: Cut 1 strip 11 3/4" x width of fabric. Cut into two 11 3/4" x 11 3/4" squares. Cut these diagonally once to make 4 corner triangles. Assembling the Quilt Top: Lay quilt in diagonal rows.

Using photo reference, lay your blocks in diagonal rows. Sew together to complete the top- MAKE SURE YOU INCLUDE THE SIDE AND CORNER TRIANGLES AS A PART OF THE ROW. The side and corner triangles will be bigger and stick out. At the cutting board you will take a wide plastic ruler and rotary cutter to straighten the edges and remove the extra fabric. Leave a 3/4" seam allowance when trimming. This will let your quilt float. Check to see that the corners are at right angles and the opposite sides are the same measurement.

#### **Cutting and Sewing Borders:**

Border 1; Cut 6 strips of eyelet/lace 2 ½"x width of fabric. Sub-cut: two at 2 ½"x 29" for top and bottom and two at 2 ½"x43" (will need to piece these strips) for sides.

From dot cut Four 2 1/2'x 2 1/2" squares.

Sew on sides first. Sew 2 1/2" squares to each end of top and bottom strips. Add to quilt center.

Border 2: Cut 4 strips 7"x length of fabric. (These will not need to be pieced)

Measure vertically through the center of the quilt to get the length. Cut two border strips to this length and sew onto the sides of the quilt first.. Then measure through the center of the quilt horizontally to get that length. Cut two border strips to this measurement. Sew on the top and bottom borders. Quilt and Bind.
