
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
Quilt Size 55" x 65"

Block Size: 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" (raw edge to raw edge)

Fabric Requirements: Based on 45" wide fabric. Please read all instructions before starting this project. All seams are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. This is an awesome stash buster quilt because you can use so many different fabrics from your stash and add others as needed.

6 light fat quarters 6 dark fat quarters 2/3 yd. for small border 2 yds. for large border 4 yds. for backing 1/2 vd. for binding





Optional Block

A = 2 1/2" $\times 2 1/2$ " B = 2 1/2" $\times 6 1/2$ " $C = 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " D = 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

OPTIONAL: $D = 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cutting Instructions

Cut 40 A's (Darks)

Cut 40 B's (Lights)

Cut 40 C's (Lights)

Cut 20 D's (Darks)

OPTIONAL: To add some more fun to this quilt, make some of the D's 4 patches. To do this, cut 4 squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" 2 out of light fabric and 2 out of dark fabric. Sew together into a 4-patch then follow sewing instructions for block.

Sewing Instructions (you will need a total of 20 blocks - follow block diagrams above).


- 1. Sew a B to the top and bottom of D. Press toward B.
- 2. Sew 1 A to 1 short end of C and press toward C. Repeat with 1 more A and C.
- 3. Sew 1 A/C to the left side of B/D and 1 A/C to the right side of B/D. Press toward A/C. Repeat until you have completed 20 blocks.

Putting it all Together

1. Following quilt diagram below, lay blocks out on the ground and move them around until you like the way it looks then sew blocks together into rows. Press the blocks in row in alternating directions, do this by pressing all the blocks in row 1 to the left and all the blocks in row 2 to the right. This way they will nest when you sew the rows together. Sew rows together until you have the whole middle of the quilt completed.

Borders

- 1. **Border** $#1 \text{cut } 6 \text{ strips } 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x width of fabric.
- 2. **Border #2** cut 4 strips 6" x length of fabric.



Once the quilt top is completed, measure through the center of the quilt to get the width. Sew your border strips together to get this measurement. Sew strips to sides first. Press seam allowances toward border. Now measure again through the center of the quilt to get the length and sew your border strips to this measurement. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seams toward the border. Repeat all these steps for the large border. Quilt, bind and enjoy!
