#### **SUPPLIES**

 $\frac{1}{3}$  yard of white print #30499 in each of the 6 colors:













1/4 yard of color print #30500 in each of the 6 colors:













 $\frac{1}{4}$  yard of color print #30501 in each of the 6 colors:













 $\frac{1}{4}$  yard of color print #30502 in each of the 6 colors:













1 yard of Gnoma Claus print #30498 in color of choice:



3 yard solid white for pocket backing yards backing fabric 52" x 76" batting

#### CUTTING

1. From each  $\frac{1}{3}$  yard of white print #30499: cut 1 square  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " cut 4 rectangles  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " cut 4 rectangles  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ "



**TIP:** For a scrappy look, alternate the prints of each colorway in steps 2-4.

2. From each ¼ yard of color print #30500: cut 2 squares 6½" x 6½" cut 1 rectangle 3½" x 12½"



3. From each ¼ yard of color print #30501: cut 2 squares 6½" x 6½" cut 1 rectangle 3½" x 12½"



4. From each ¼ yard of color print #30502: cut 2 squares 6½" x 6½" cut 2 rectangles 3½" x 6½"

#### **ASSEMBLE**

- 4. Cut 6 8 (or desired amount) Gnomas in varying sizes from the Gnoma Claus print fabric, keeping your cuts about 3/8" from the outline of each Gnoma. Placing right sides together, arrange the Gnomas on the white solid pocket backing fabric. Stitch around the edges (on the outlines) of each Gnoma, leaving a 3" opening for turning at the bottom of each one. Trim the white solid fabric to match the shape of each Gnoma before turning each one right-side-out and pressing flat. (There's no need to stitch closed the opening you left for turning.)
- 5. Make four blocks from each colorway:









6. Join the four blocks into a row:



7. Join the rows, catching gmoma pockets between the layers. Trim off unused Gnoma bottom.



#### **FINISH**

- 8. Join all the rows using the finished quilt diagram on the cover page as a reference. Stay stitch around the outside of the quilt top, catching the sides of any Gnoma pockets that haven't already been sewn into the seams between the blocks.
- Layer with batting and backing. Quilt as desired.
   Top-stitch the edges of each Gnoma from his base to halfway up his cap (or desired location), and pivot around and top-stich back down to his base to form a pocket.
- 10. With the left-over scraps of color print fabrics, cut into strips of 2½" wide rectangles. Join the rectangles end to end to form a 21′ (252″) binding strip. Bind. Done. Snuggle.
