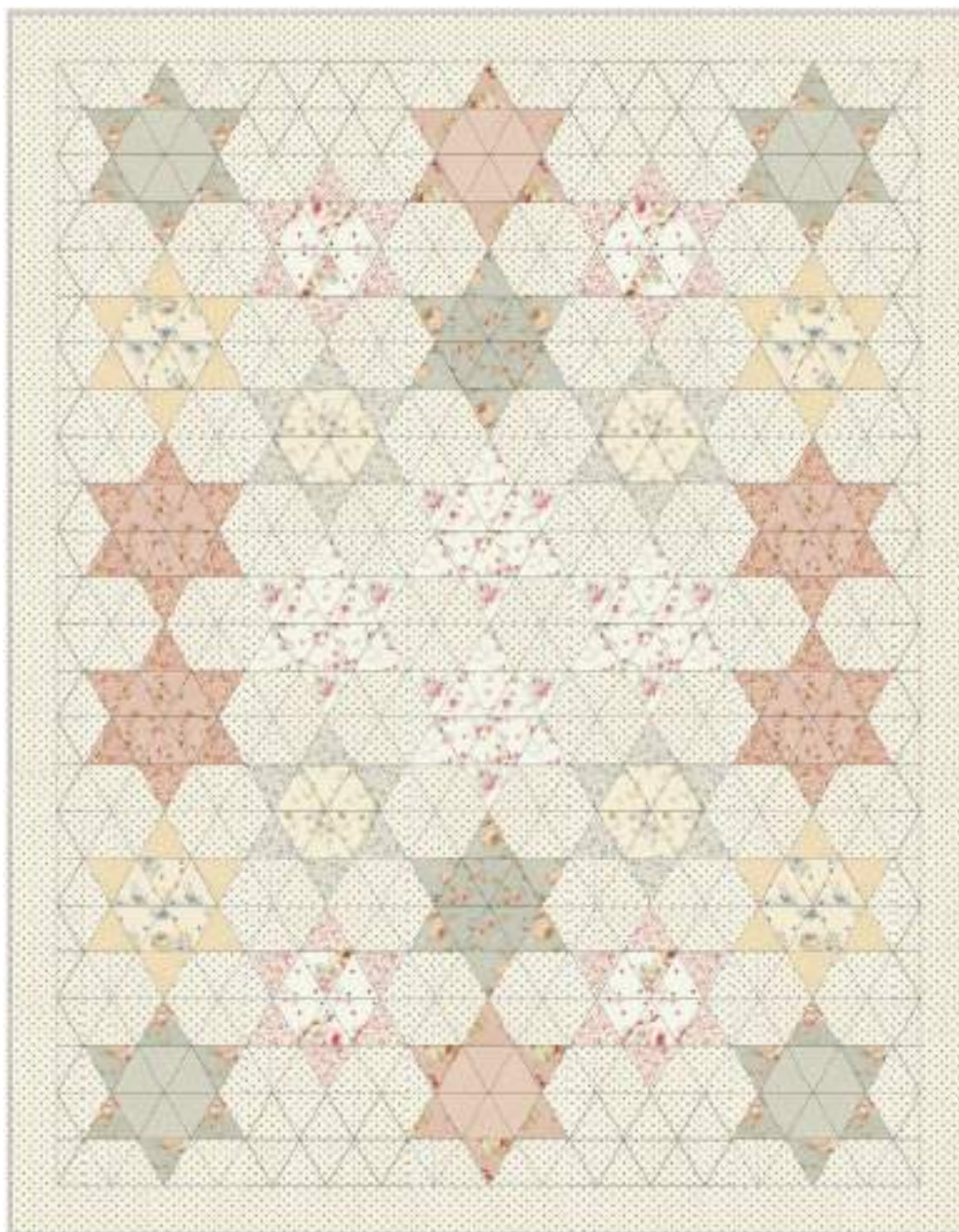
## The Durham Quilt

Featuring the "Durham" collection

Finished Size: 61" x 78"

Designed by Lynne Goldsworthy for Lecien

Skill level: easy to medium – pattern uses printable paper templates for cutting out the triangles and machine piecing



### Fabric Requirements

Durham prints  
31930-70 (background)  
31930-71 (binding)  
31927-20 (backing)

Batting

Thread for piecing and quilting

One FQ bundle (14 prints needed)

3 yards

½ yard

4 yards

69" x 86"

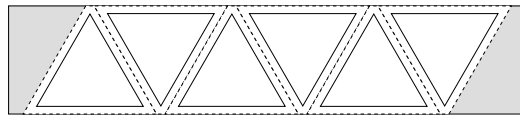

## Notes

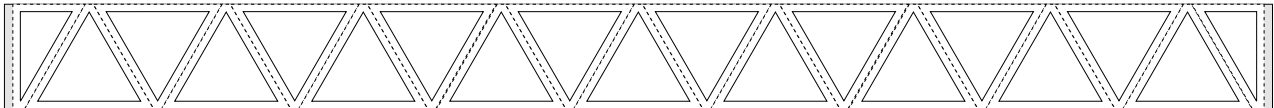
- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF = width of fabric – a strip of fabric cut from selvage to selvage or from the center cut to selvage if cutting a FQ.

## Cutting The Fabrics

1. Following the fabric layout in the main quilt image, pick the fourteen FQs that make up the twenty-eight stars. Cut each into four  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and cut each of those into six B templates rotating as shown in the diagram below.



2. Cut the background fabric into twenty-three  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips. Cut twenty-two of the strips into one A, seventeen B and one C triangle template shape(s) as shown in the diagram below. Cut one of the strips into two A, six B and two C triangles. Sew the remaining  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips end to end and cut into two  $61\frac{1}{2}$ " and two  $72\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths.



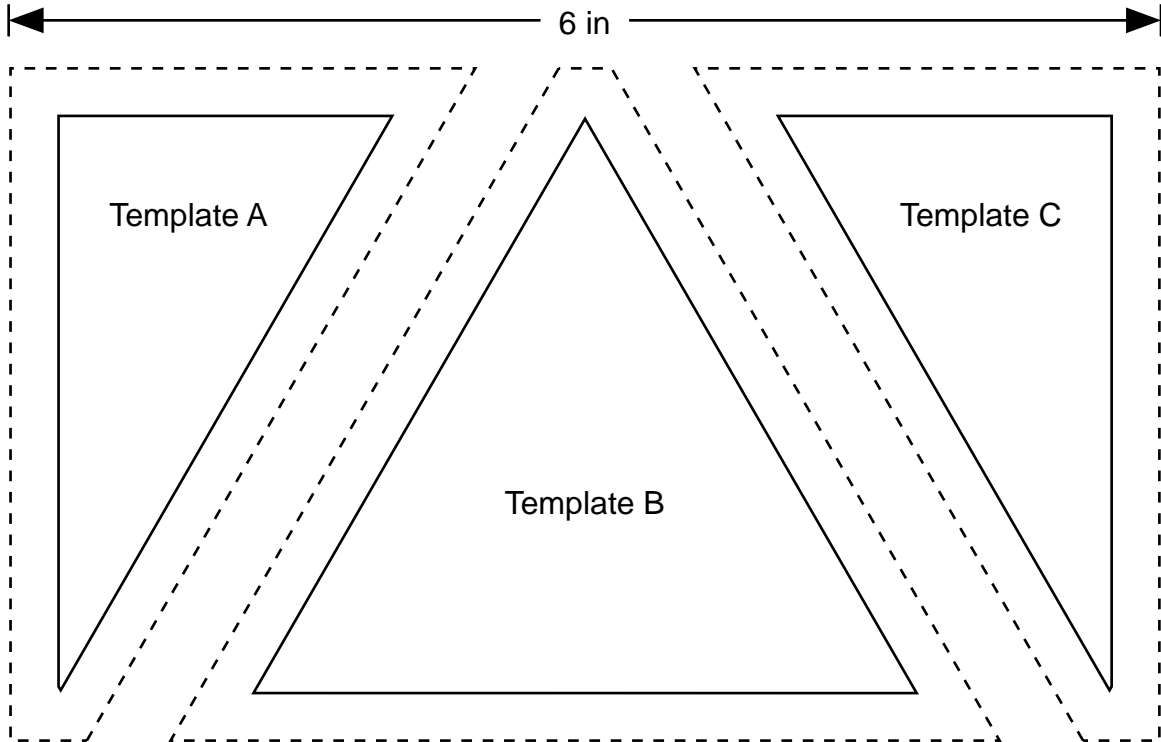
3. Cut the backing fabric into two equal lengths and the binding fabric into eight  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

## Assembling the quilt top

1. Following the layout in the main quilt image, sew the quilt top center into twenty-four rows. Each row will have an A or C BKG fabric triangle at each end and thirty-one BKG and print triangles in between.
2. Sew the twenty-four rows together taking care to match the points on the triangles.
3. Sash the sides of the finished quilt top center with the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $72\frac{1}{2}$ " then the top and bottom with the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $61\frac{1}{2}$ " BKG fabric strips.

## Finishing the quilt

1. Cut the backing fabric into two equal lengths, remove selvages and sew together to make the quilt back.
2. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
3. Make a quilt sandwich, basting together the quilt back, the batting and the quilt top.
4. Quilt as desired then trim the quilt square, removing excess batting and backing. We used Lecien Tsumugi #110 thread on the front and back.
5. Bind the quilt taking care to mitre the corners.



Make sure that the template is printed at "100%" or "no scaling" and double check that the guide line has printed to the right size.
