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# **The Magical Patch Quilt**

Skill level: simple - pattern uses raw edge applique and simple piecing



# **Fabric Requirements**

31902-30 and 100 31903-30, 60 and 100 31905-30, 60 and 90 31906-60	One FQ
31902-70 31903-70 31905-110	½ yard
Lecien Solids #551 White (BKG) 31902-100 (binding) 31903-10 (backing)	4 ½ yards ½ yard 4 ½ yards

Lecien Tsumugi thread #110

Fusible web (18" wide) 10 yards

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#### **Notes**


- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- 1/4" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvage to selvage.
- BKG background fabric

## **Cutting the fabrics**

1. Use the orange peel template to cut the following numbers of orange peels from each of the fabrics A-L indicated in the diagram to the right

Fabrics	Cut
A, E, F	Twelve
B, C, D, G, H, I and K	Eight
J and L	Four

- 2. Cut the BKG fabric into:
- Nine 12 ½" WOF strips and cut those into twenty-five 12 ½" squares
- Seven 6 ½" WOF strips.
  Sew end to end and cut into two 60 ½" and two 72 ½" lengths.



### Making the quilt top

- 1. For each fabric, trace a set of orange peels onto fusible web. For example, for fabric B, trace eight orange peels onto a piece of fusible web the size of a FQ.
- 2. Fuse the orange peel sheets to the back of the fabrics and cut out the orange peel shapes.
- 3. Use the diagram above to fuse sets of orange peels to 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " BKG squares making sure to leave a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance gap around the edge of the fabric. You will make four of each of squares 1-5 and one of square 6.
- 4. Sew around the edges of each of the orange peel pieces using a straight, blanket or zigzag stitch to secure.
- 5. Sew the blocks into five rows of five following the layout in the main quilt image. Sew the five rows together.
- 6. Sash the sides of the quilt top with the 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60  $\frac{1}{2}$ " then the top and bottom with the 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72  $\frac{1}{2}$ " BKG fabric strips.



## Finishing the quilt

- 1. Cut the backing fabric into two equal lengths, remove selvages and sew together to make the quilt back.
- 2. Cut the binding fabric into seven 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips. Sew end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 3. Make a quilt sandwich, basting together the quilt back, the batting and the quilt top.
- 4. Quilt as desired then trim the quilt square, removing excess batting and backing. We used Lecien Tsumugi #110 thread on the front and back.
- 5. Bind the quilt taking care to mitre the corners.

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
